

Householding in Salesforce

The use of households in CRM allows individuals to be grouped as a single entity. Those individuals may act independently, and have those activities aggregated when necessary. An example:

Two donors to an organization each give money to an organization's annual fund. These donors happen to be married and live at the same address. The development director would like to send one thank you letter to the couple, acknowledging their combined contribution to the organization. This task can be accomplished by generating the thank you letters based on household, and aggregating the gifts of all members of the household into a combined giving total.

Many nonprofits use households in their CRM activities. This paper will present one way to handle households in the online CRM system Salesforce.com.

Limitations of Salesforce.com in Working with Individuals

Salesforce.com was built with an underlying bias to Business to Business (B2B) interactions. While nonprofits engage in B2B activities (grant applications, projects on contract, etc.) they also rely heavily on Business to Consumer (B2C) interactions in the form of individual giving programs. Because Salesforce.com is not built to handle B2C interactions, a work around is necessary. Currently there are two main work arounds for B2C:

1. Each individual in Salesforce.com has a Contact and an Account created for them.
2. Individuals that are not affiliated with a company have a Contact created that is tied to a single Account specifically reserved for these individuals.

This method of Householding applies to work around #2. It could be modified to support work around #1, but I have not pursued that avenue.

To implement this method of Householding in support of Contacts in an Individual catch-all Account, follow the instructions below.

Creating New Custom Objects

New objects are created by clicking:

Setup >Build >Custom Objects >New Custom Object



Household Object

The Household object will connect multiple contacts together in a Household. It can be used to handle all recognition and mailing functions for individual donors, if you so choose.

Create a new custom object with the following values:

Create a tab for **Household**.

Add the following custom fields to the **Household** object:

Modifying Existing Objects

Modify existing objects by clicking:

Setup >Customize > [Name of the object to be modified]

Contact Object

Add the following custom fields:

Field Label	Data Type	Values	Default
Household	Lookup(Household)	NA	NA

Modify the Page Layout for **Contact** to show the Household relationship lookup field. You can hide all mailing information on the Contact if you desire. The Household object can be used to handle all mail-base communications.

How it Works

- A **Household Object instance** is created for each household. If a Contact does not live with another Contact, a **Household** is still created.
- All **Contacts** in that **Household** are associated to the **Household object instance**.
- Mailing preferences for that **Household** are set on the **Household object instance**
- **Opportunities** (donations) are associated with **Contacts** via **Contact Roles**.
- Recognition Name is used to address the Household. It would be something like, “Bob and Sue Jordan,” or, “The Sanders Family.”

Reporting

- All reporting that requires mailing address should be done using the **Household** object. It is available for **Contact** and **Account** reports, as well as **Opportunity** reports.
- Mailings, thank you letters, etc. are only sent to **Households**.

Future

- Some UI customization to allow for simultaneous Contact and Household creation would be nice



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- Salesforce.com is probably working on B2C functionality that will at some point probably include Householding. Other industries do B2C and Householding, so they likely have a reason to solve these problems.
